


<p>17 state of nature</p> <p>a concept used in political philosophy to describe the conditions of what the lives of people might have been like before societies came into existence</p>  <p>Example: In a state of nature, nobody is truly safe.</p> <p>(SS080104)</p>	<p>18 resources</p> <p>a source of supply, support or aid that is necessary for human survival; a natural feature or phenomenon that enhances the quality of human life</p>  <p>Example: People need resources to survive.</p> <p>(SS080104)</p>
<p>19 natural rights</p> <p>a political idea that an individual enters into society with certain basic rights and that no government can deny these rights</p>  <p>Example: People consent or agree to form a government in order to protect their natural rights.</p> <p>(SS080104)</p>	<p>20 life</p> <p>the right to survive and feel safe from threats to your existence</p>  <p>Example: Murder often carries severe penalties in most societies because it violates one's right to life.</p> <p>(SS080104)</p>
<p>21 liberty</p> <p>freedom; the ability to choose without external interference considered by Enlightenment philosophers to be a natural right</p>  <p>Example: In order to protect important liberties, people give up the right to do whatever they want.</p>	<p>22 property</p> <p>possessions such as land and objects, considered by Enlightenment philosophers to be a natural right</p>  <p>Example: In order to protect private property, people establish rules and laws under a system of government.</p> <p>(SS080104)</p>

<p>23 social contract/social compact</p>  <p>an agreement among the members of a society that individuals willingly surrender some of their natural rights in exchange for protection by the society in the form of laws and rules</p> <p>Example: The people in the United States created a social compact through the U.S. Constitution.</p> <p>(SS080104)</p>
